

Marchegg was built in 1260 on the bank of the Morava river, on the border with the neighbouring Kingdom of Hungary. Today, the town is known for the eponymous Baroque Palace - and for its storks.


— Marchegg is home to Central Europe's largest colony of white storks breeding in trees. The birds build their nests in the old trees of the Marchauen Nature Reserve, which is managed by the WWF. This habitat is ideal for breeding their chicks.

— Roam the waymarked visitor trails through the pristine riparian forest along the Morava or unwind on one of the platforms specially built for you to watch "Master Adebar" in its majestic flight. Huts along the paths invite visitors to make a stopover in this habitat of beavers, kingfishers and fire-bellied toads. If you're lucky, you might even cross paths with a herd of Konik ponies. This sturdy horse breed lives in the riparian reserve all year round, perfectly adapted to its wildlife environment. Thank you for treating these wonderful animals with respect!

There is a lot to discover in and around Marchegg Palace, which boasts a rich culture, culinary delights, and a one-of-a-kind nature experience. Nature has literally gained entry into the palace, with bats living in the attic and the famous storks of Marchegg breeding on the roof. Needless to say, the adventure doesn't stop at the palace's threshold: two circular paths invite visitors to stroll around the town, thereby passing multiple stone witnesses of the old days: the historical route leads along the town wall to the church, the old Hungarian Gate, and back to the palace.

Explore the pristine landscape of the Marchfeld plain by boat, by foot, or on an idyllic bicycle tour – there's something for every taste.


— Austria's "granary", or "vegetable garden", is only a short hop from Vienna or Bratislava! The vastness of the landscape and fields of the Marchfeld is reminiscent of an old oil painting. Such natural diversity is rare these days. It is fair to say that the Marchfeld is a hotspot of biodiversity in the heart of Central Europe.

— Cultural monuments tell of Baroque rulership, decisive battles, and a half-forgotten era. Escape from the treadmill, relax, and explore the fascinating natural and cultural secrets of the Marchfeld plain.



Beauty on wheels: Rent a bike in Marchegg and pedal across the Morava river on one of two bridges connecting Austria with the neighbouring region of Záhorie and Bratislava. Alternatively, take the train from Marchegg.





EXPLORE THE MYSTERIES OF NATURE

The great diversity of the region includes rare species of plants and animals hiding in the river landscapes and undisturbed riparian forests. The same is true of the Danube-Auen National Park, the steppe landscape of the Weikendorf Remise nature reserve, the sandy hills of Obwerweiden, and the stork colony. The beauty of the Marchfeld is composed of many puzzle pieces waiting to be discovered.

SUN-KISSED VEGETABLES & SWEET FRUIT

The Marchfeld's special soils, the exceptionally favourable Pannonian climate, and the tireless work of local people provide ideal conditions for a bountiful harvest: asparagus, strawberries, sugar beet, hazelnut, peas, raspberries, cherries, etc. Compose your own, individual culinary tour and taste your way through the delicacies of local restaurants and food producers.

EXPLORE THE CULTURAL RICHES AND COLOURFUL PAST

The Marchfeld is peppered with architectural witnesses of the region's long history. Decisive battles in European history were fought here; Austria's first steam-powered train was operated, connecting the imperial capital and royal seat of Vienna with the industrial region of Silesia. The Habsburg Monarchy also rose and fell in the Marchfeld: it rose with the victory of Rudolf I of Habsburg over King Ottokar II of Bohemia in the Battle on the Marchfeld at Dürnkrut and Jedenspeigen, and it fell centuries later when the last Emperor, Karl, departed into exile from the Kopfstetten train station.

— Today, you can stroll through the Marchfeld's numerous, magnificent palaces and gardens or travel back in time at cultural, theatrical, musical and cinematic events held indoor or outdoor. Which is to say that the Marchfeld's cultural landscape is as rich as its natural landscape.
